MILFORD FAIR RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. No entry fee for any exhibit.
- 2. All exhibitors must be <u>residents of South Marysburgh</u> or students of Athol-South Marysburgh Public School.
- 3. Prizes will be distributed on or before November 11th.
- 4. All exhibits must be property of township residents and displayed at your own risk.
- 5. Exhibits may be brought in between 6 to 9pm Friday or 8 to 10am Saturday. All exhibits MUST be in place by 10:00 a.m. SATURDAY. Judging starts at once and ONLY Officials are to remain during judging.
- 6. EXHIBITS MUST STAY IN PLACE UNTIL 4:30 P.M. SATURDAY.
- 7. In case of bad weather, or other unforeseen circumstances, this Society binds itself to pay that percentage of prize money as is consistent with the receipts.
- 8. Anyone not understanding how prizes are awarded is strongly advised to enquire of the President or any other official before exhibits are removed.
- Entry tags must be securely tied or pinned to exhibits before entering them in the Fair. Print clearly, the CLASS and NUMBER of class (as they appear on the prize list) and your NAME and PHONE NUMBER.
- 10. Please take special care to properly fill out entry forms.
- 11. One entry allowed in each division of any class.
- 12. Exhibitors may enter only one age category in each section.
- 13. EXHIBITS SHALL NOT HAVE BEEN SHOWN AT PREVIOUS MILFORD FAIRS.

Suggestions to Exhibitors

- READ YOUR PRIZE LIST very carefully and exhibit what is called for in each class.
- BE ON TIME and have your exhibits ready so that we may follow our program.
- **GRAIN:** Take a gallon of threshed grain & and spread out on a table. Look it over carefully, removing all green, broken or diseased kernels, chaff and weed seeds. Show only largest plumpest grain.
- **POTATOES:** Select the proper number. See that they are the same size, shape and typical of the variety, or medium size and free from scab, bruises and diseases of any kind.
- **CORN**: Select the proper number of ears. See that they are uniform in size and length of kernels, straight and well filled at tip and butt. Remove husk.
- TURNIPS: Select required number of smooth, medium sized roots. Trim
 off tops and roots.
- **BEETS:** Select required number of smooth, medium sized beets, 2 1/2 inches in diameter, as dark as possible. Cut off tops.
- ONIONS: Select good sized onions with thin necks. DO NOT PEEL.
- **CARROTS:** Should be uniform in size and shape, free of sunburn, not too large but true to type of variety. Cut off tops.
- PARSNIPS: Uniform size, smooth, straight. Cut off tops.

In 2006...

"We've brought back rolling pin hurling as one of the sixtieth anniversary activities. The prize for the longest throw is the same thing that the contestants competed for in 1946: a pair of nylon stockings."

In the 1970s...

"Miss Terry McCrimmon of Milford, a nurse-in-training, was crowned Miss South Marysburgh as a result of a beauty and talent contest held in connection with the Milford Fair, Wednesday night. The dark-haired beauty clinched the title by also scoring well in giving a reading. Judges were Mrs. Gordon Bell, Sam Gentile and Phil Dodds.

Mr. Gentile, in announcing the winners, commented on the closeness of the points and the unusually attractive contestants."

Official Rules...

"Cow Patty Bingo involves penning a cow into an enclosed area that has been divided into a grid. The squares of the grid are numbered and "sold" for a chance to win a prize. If the cow drops a cow patty on your square, you win."

In 1964...

Five members of the orchestra were each given a can of ham for their services at the evening show.

In 2003...

"At the monthly Fair Board meetings we are prepared to deal with issues of any size. At the July meeting, the Fair Board approved a recommendation to reduce from five to three the required number of muffins on a plate entered in the muffin category of the baking contest."

In the 1960s...

"Crowds were lined up at 6:30 p.m. on the steps of Mount Tabor Playhouse, waiting to get in for the Evening Show. As rain threatened, organizers decided to open the doors to them in spite of the fact that there were no tickets on site yet. The audience got indoors just as the skies opened and the rain poured down.

An interesting Milford note: those who were let in early were requested to pay when the tickets arrived and, apparently, every single one of them did.
